# Leadership openings at SORTEE

#### 1. SORTEE needs a treasurer

This is an exciting opportunity to join the core leadership of the SORTEE organization. Our wonderful treasurer, Alexa Fredston, is stepping down at the end of 2025, and we're looking for a volunteer to step into that role. Although we will not need a new treasurer for nine months, we hope to receive nominations by May 1st to facilitate the transition. We therefore encourage you to start thinking about volunteering now and reach out to SORTEE leadership soon (see below). Unfortunately, because we are a US-based organization and do our banking in the US, the treasurer must be based in the US, and ideally would be a US citizen. Because of the responsibilities associated with this role, we will prioritize candidates who are willing to commit to a minimum of two years in the position. The volunteer treasurer must be approved by the board of directors after which they automatically become an officer and a member of the executive committee.

Says Alexa, "I'm happy to chat with people on slack, zoom, whatsapp, etc., or however else is helpful. No questions are too small and absolutely no hard feelings if it isn't for you."

Alexa also noted that volunteering as a treasurer is readily understood as important service by others outside of SORTEE "because everyone knows what a Treasurer is, so many employers and colleagues understand the significant contribution you would be making."

#### 2. Manage in-person socials

The Member Engagement committee is still one person short this year. We are looking for someone to support in-person SORTEE meet-ups at the conferences of other societies in ecology and evolutionary biology (see here: <a href="https://www.sortee.org/meet-ups/">https://www.sortee.org/meet-ups/</a>).

\*Task description\*: The In-person Socials Manager promotes and tracks SORTEE in-person meet-ups, supplies materials (e.g. SORTEE poster, stickers, t-shirts, some funds for buying food and drinks) to meet-up hosts, and helps hosts plan and promote the meet-up.

\*Why volunteer?\* This is an opportunity to interact with colleagues to promote SORTEE, experience SORTEE behind the scenes, and get to know and work with fellow SORTEE members! #### 3. Become a website editor

We are building a team of website editors. If you think you might be available to edit the website, we'd love to hear from you. The time commitment is generally modest (on the order of one or two hours per month) - it usually involves posting blogs, news, and updating contents of the web pages, as needed. The website content is in RMarkdown and is edited on GitHub, then automatically deployed as a GitPage via Netlify. ## SORTEE Conference 2025 - save the date

The fifth annual <u>SORTEE Conference</u> will be held virtually in October 2025 (continuously from October 15th to October 16th, to cover all timezones). The conference will be **FREE** for SORTEE members, and ranging from 0\$ to 60\$ for non-SORTEE members.

The conference is a forum to **discuss** and **develop ideas**, while also exploring **current practices** for advancing research in fields related to ecology and evolutionary biology.

The conference will be a mix of 5 session types:

 Unconferences: Facilitated discussions of ideas for how to make ecology, evolutionary biology, and related disciplines more open, reliable, and transparent.

- **Hackathons:** Group projects with well-defined goals (papers, techniques, software, protocols, organizations, etc.).
- **Workshops:** Facilitators will teach tools to implement open, reliable, and transparent practices.
- **Plenaries**: Two plenaries about recent initiatives in open science.
- **Introductions to open science:** Two sessions dedicated to people new to open science.

### **SORTEE Commendation Awards**

The SORTEE Commendation Awards aim to highlight projects that align with the aims and values of the society. A project is defined as any work that is an initiative benefiting the eco-evo community by fostering open science values or practices (e.g., journal clubs, workshops, seminar series, websites, repositories, tools, educational materials, public talks, podcasts, etc.). The SORTEE Commendation Awards recognise that projects are often team efforts. As such, the contributions of all project members, rather than individuals, will be highlighted. SORTEE warmly encourages diverse nominations in terms of team membership. Project nominations can be submitted year-round until two months before the SORTEE conference. # EcoEvoRxiv updates

EcoEvoRxiv now has 2111 preprints, and our new paper describing "The promise of community-driven preprints in ecology and evolution" is now published (Noble et al. 2025. journal: <a href="https://doi.org/10.1098/rspb.2024.1487">https://doi.org/10.32942/X2SS46</a>). This paper describes our progress to date and sets out ideas for the future. The authors of that paper include members of the EcoEvoRxiv Committee as well as many other SORTEE members.

Our new EcoEvoRxiv editors for 2025 are also now on-boarded! Welcome to Niky Wu, Nilandri Mondal, and Mark Young. We'll be kicking off our new non-English manuscript acceptance process in the coming months which will see a huge increase in the number of languages we accept. Thanks to all the many SORTEE volunteers who put up their hand to help with this process.

Behind the scenes, things are looking good for the infrastructure supporting EcoEvoRxiv. The team we work with at California Digital Library (CDL), which hosts EcoEvoRxiv, envisage continued funding into the foreseeable future despite the general funding uncertainty in the US. In addition, we are expecting updates soon to the online publishing platform used by CDL, Janeway. Janeway 1.8 should be released next month, and the new system will incorporate better checkpoints to make sure authors have uploaded correct meta-data and it will have updated metrics data for each preprint as well as a feature that allows us to export these metrics. However, we're still working with the CDL to push Janeway to add additional features so that authors can do meta-data corrections themselves, as this is a common issue that needs to be dealt with manually by EcoEvoRxiv editors.
