SORTEE needs a treasurer!

This is an exciting opportunity to join the core leadership of the SORTEE organization. Our wonderful treasurer, Alexa Fredston, is stepping down at the end of 2025, and we're looking for a volunteer to step into that role. Although we will not need a new treasurer for nine months, we hope to receive nominations now to facilitate the transition. We therefore encourage you to start thinking about volunteering now and reach out to SORTEE leadership soon (see below). Unfortunately, because we are a US-based organization and do our banking in the US, the treasurer must be based in the US, and ideally would be a US citizen. Because of the responsibilities associated with this role, we will prioritize candidates who are willing to commit to a minimum of two years in the position. The volunteer treasurer must be approved by the board of directors after which they automatically become an officer and a member of the executive committee.

If you are interested in this responsibility, we encourage you to reach out to the president, secretary, or current treasurer, Alexa Fredston, directly (treasurer.sortee@gmail.com or fredston@ucsc.edu). Says Alexa, "I'm happy to chat with people on slack, zoom, whatsapp, etc., or however else is helpful. No questions are too small and absolutely no hard feelings if it isn't for you."

Alexa also noted that volunteering as a treasurer is readily understood as important service by others outside of SORTEE "because everyone knows what a Treasurer is, so many employers and colleagues understand the significant contribution you would be making."

The SORTEE Commendation Awards recognise that projects are often team efforts. As such, the contributions of all project members, rather than individuals, will be highlighted. SORTEE warmly encourages diverse nominations in terms of team membership. Project nominations can be submitted year-round until two months before the SORTEE conference. You're invited to **MorphoBank Connects 2025!** A **FREE** virtual conference on **September 18 and 19, 2025**. This event will highlight innovative ways to leverage MorphoBank, an open-access repository and collaborative workspace for morphological character matrices, to advance Open Science and FAIR data practices. Activities include a curation workshop, data mining hackathon, user community forum, project support office hours, and invited and submitted presentations.

We invite presentations that share how MorphoBank can serve as a central database, collaborative workspace, and secure repository to drive forward Open Science and FAIR data principles. Submissions might include:

- Novel Research Applications: Case studies that leverage morphological character matrices for evolutionary analyses, ecological modeling, or biodiversity assessments.
- Advanced Workflows & Tools: Descriptions of pipelines or scripts that integrate MorphoBank data with other platforms (e.g., R, Python, GIS) to automate curation, visualization, or statistical analyses.
- Non-Traditional Uses: Innovative uses of MorphoBank beyond classical character scoring such as geometric morphometrics, histological image annotations, 3D model integration, or outreach-focused teaching modules.
- Community Engagement & FAIR Best Practices: Reports on collaborative projects, community-driven hackathons, metadata standardization efforts, or strategies for enhancing data reusability and reproducibility.

✍️ Submit a **250-word abstract** (no refs/images/tables) that includes title, authors names, affiliations, and ORCID IDs, and 4-6 keywords.

 The abstract submission **deadline is July 24, 2025.**

🕒 Accepted presentations will be scheduled as **15-minute talks** followed by 5 minutes of Q&A in **20-minute** slots. All talks will be recorded and (if you opt in) posted to our YouTube channel after the conference for broader reach and future reference.

Lifecycle Journal - a new scholarly communication format from the Center for Open Science

[Lifecycle Journal](#) is a new model of scholarly communication launched by the [Center for Open Science \(COS\)](#) in early 2025. Designed to enhance transparency and trust in research, Lifecycle Journal is a 3-year pilot exploring a community-driven model of publishing and evaluation. *Lifecycle Journal* supports open science throughout the research lifecycle, enabling research outputs to be shared, published, and evaluated at all stages. It uses a 'publish-before-review' model where research is published before undergoing evaluation, enabling control by the scholarly community itself.

Community-led evaluation beyond traditional peer review from distributed human and machine-based evaluation service partners provides an opportunity for innovators and evaluators to try, evaluate, and improve new methods of review. *Lifecycle Journal* is now open for submissions.
